## Residents Invited to Tour New Biodiesel Plant at Sanimax Open House

**DeForest, Wis.** – Residents are invited to see the future of renewable energy firsthand at a community open house Sept. 18 from 2 to 6 p.m. at the Sanimax Biodiesel Plant and Restaurant Services Facility, 605 Bassett St.

The event will feature tours of Wisconsin's largest biodiesel plant, which processes animal fats and vegetable oils into clean-burning automotive fuel. Tours will also visit the next-door restaurant services facility, which converts restaurant grease and related wastes into useful products.
